SURPRISE ITEM FOR MAYOR

A SURPRISE item at Monday night's wrestling programme in Wisbech Corn Exchange was a mixed bout between Lady Caroline and Lord Snooty Monk.

A large audience, which included the Mayor of Wisbech, Coun. W. P. Pomeroy, saw a mixed bout which replaced the scheduled Ken Davies v Ric Charles bout. After taking an early fall Lady Caroline was disqualified for fouling her opponent.

The main bout was between Big Chief Thunderbird, the Indian Sascechewan, and Johnny Romeiro. The indian giant won by a knock-out.

Jack Taylor beat Michael La-Roach by a technical knock-out and Lance Morgan beat Mick Collins by the same decision.

Question :

Lady Caroline from Oxford, the girl wrestler appears to be very much anti-man. Is she a single girl and an active show jumper still ?

Caroline left the show jump ring on meeting the wrestler JACK TAYLOR. This was quite a number of years ago. Though fans themselves are not aware of it, it is common knowledge amongst the wrestling fraternity that in fact, Caroline is Mrs. Jack Taylor, and that they live in a beautiful detached house in the Leicestershire countryside.

Rumour has it that **LADY CAROLINE** may also be out of action soon for a spell, not baby clothes is it, Caroline ? ?

Incidentally, Caroline was featured in the American magazine **WRESTLING REVIEW**, December issue, which told the story of her wrestling career. Makes interesting reading.



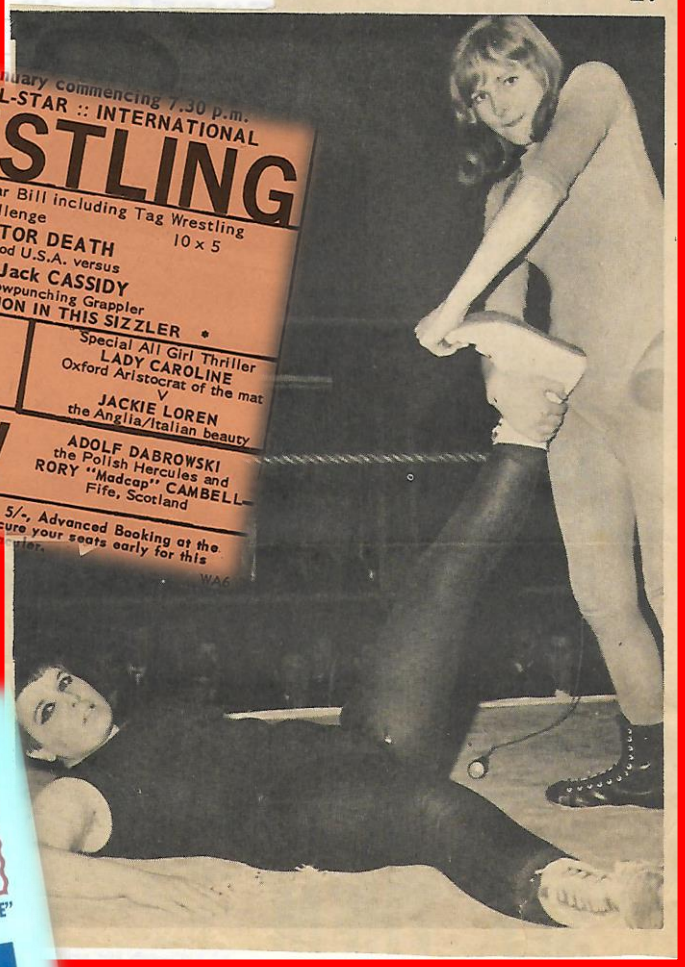
WRESTLER CAROLINE WINS AT WISBECH

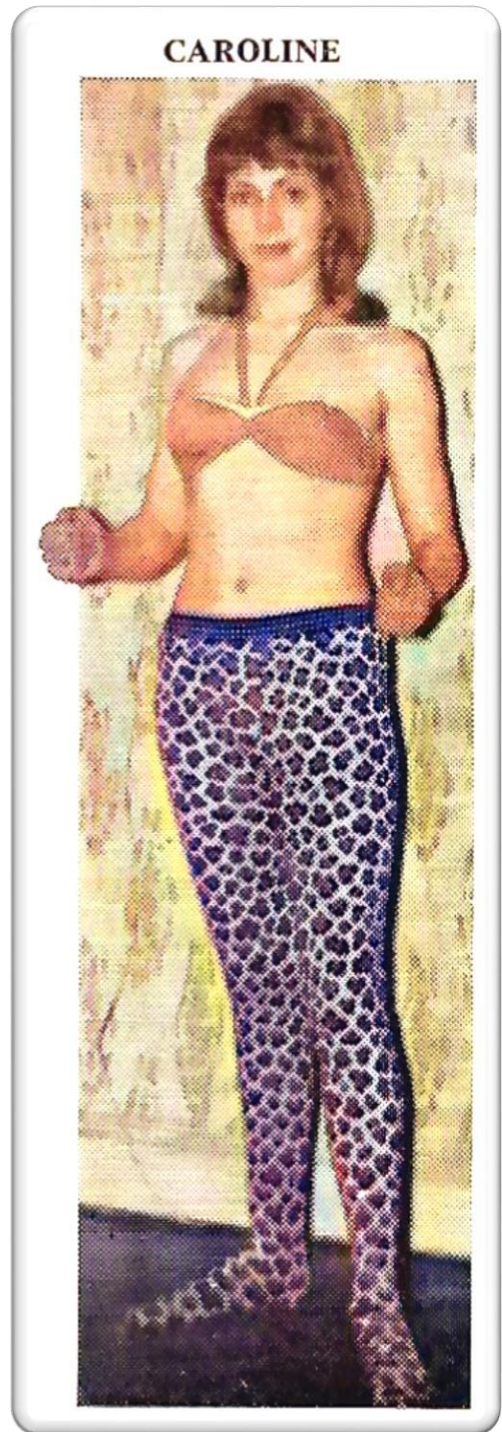

Britain's Lady Caroline, One Of New Female Breed

LONDON, ENGLAND—Twenty-one year old Northampton girl Caroline Rolf is a pretty blonde. She's slightly built, curvacious and soft spoken. She is one of the new female breed of professional wrestlers.

It is true that she doesn't look tough enough to fight her way out of a paper bag, but she is making a hit in wrestling circuits all over the country. For, as Caroline, who recently made a TV appearance, explained, women wrestlers are still something of a novelty.

She has been wrestling some eighteen months, has wrestled everywhere they will allow girl wrestlers in this Country, as far down as Redruth, way up at Middlesborough, Skegness, Nottingham, London at Leicester Square Hall. But she is more famous in Midlands towns such as Peterborough, Boston, Ilkeston, Mansfield, Coalville, Tamworth, Wellingborough, Wisbech and St. Ives.

I was able to pin Caroline down for this interview at her home, Bulwick House, where I had caught up with her enjoying a well deserved rest. It seems she took up the sport—"because I wanted to do something different". A very independent type, Caroline says there are women police officers, women athletes and swimmers, women traffic wardens, even a woman Minister of Transport, why not women wrestlers?

Before she took up treading the canvas, Caroline was a horse show jump rider but a back injury after a fall forced her to give up her main love. Having to undertake special remedial exercises whilst in hospital started her interest in wrestling, at this time purely as a spectator.

Caroline considers herself fortunate in being allowed to utilize the gymnasium frequented by male wrestlers. She soon was pulling about in the ring with the men, and showing them a thing or two. In the spacious lounge of her mother's country home, Caroline had me on my back in two seconds.

What did Caroline think about those who take objections to women wrestling. "I wouldn't particularly call them 'cranks'" says she, "but I do think people should be able to please themselves whether they support girl wrestling or not".



Here is pretty blonde Lady Caroline, one of the most popular girl grapplers in Britain. She's 21 years old, and averages two or three matches per week.

The Wrestling Federation of Great Britain, after deliberate and careful thought, almost three years ago gave its blessing to the licensing of girls for professional wrestling. In other words, they gave the go-ahead to their Member-Promoters to use girl wrestlers on their programmes.

That decision still stands, and all girls have wrestled practically in all quarters of the British Isles. Some girl grapplers have played a great part in re-kindling interest in the mat sport, especially in areas where the patrons had lost interest and more than one previously sound Hall that attendances (or lack of them) had finally closed, girl wrestlers have now given a lease of life and the wrestling is back again in full force, with full houses once again.

Call it yet another gimmick if you may, whilst the male wrestler himself knows full well the girl cannot stand the same pace as himself, it goes on record that several of these female amazons have had to 'pack it in' because of ring injuries. In particular the former Show Jumper star, *LADY CAROLINE*, the Oxford gal aristocrat who lives at Bulwick, was unceremoniously carted off to the Kettering Hospital following a very bad fall going over the top rope in one match. The petite, slim, attractive young Lady

underwent two operations before they would finally release her, but from the latest reports Caroline is again back in training. . . . even with the girls the preparation is arduous and time consuming.

This girl, like many others, just lives for wrestling and it would about break her heart if the promoters gave her her marching orders.

The report at the top of this programme shows the new view being taken by various authorities and it is our earnest hope that in time girl wrestling will finally be accepted by all Councils and Corporations where previously they have frowned on the idea.

Girls too are constantly getting into the Newspapers. . . . Paul Pickering in the *Sunday Express* last week of January told of the 'blonde bombshell' *MARIA RIVOLDI* who comes from Oldham. The story took practically half a page and was full of interesting factors in this life surrounding the female participant of wrestling.

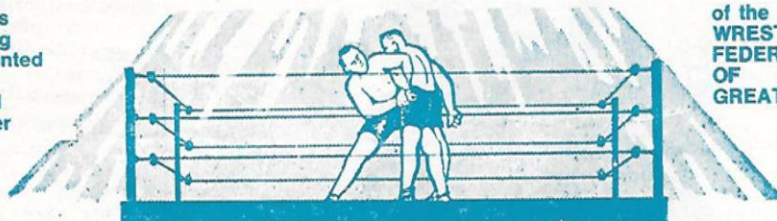

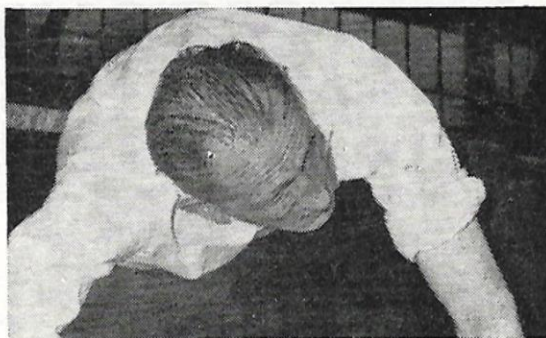

LADY CAROLINE

Girl in the news currently is pretty 22 year old LADY CAROLINE ROLFE, a curvacious quietly spoken ash blonde.

Claiming equality with the males, Caroline is a girl wrestler a new breed of superwoman. This tough as nails young lady has been wrestling now for nigh on eighteen months and in my interview with her, tells me she loves every minute of it.

It would appear that Caroline got into the mat sport purely by accident: A horse lover, former show jump star.

she had the misfortune to come adrift from a horse on some Hunter trials in Essex, which grounded the poor girl and put her in hospital for a spell. Back at her mother's country residence, on the Northamptonshire borders, it was apparent that Caroline was destined for a long rest for the back injury, according to the specialist attending her would take a while to heal, even with remedial exercises and daily massage. It was at this interim period of Caroline's life that she started to follow the local professional wrestling

tournaments at the Victoria Hall, Oakham in Rutland. Her zest for life and the unusual, one thing led to another and Caroline was soon experimenting with light weight-training to strengthen her back muscles in the very same gymnasium that the professional wrestlers used.

She had read in the Yankee wrestling magazines all about the amazons of the American girl wrestling, and was soon trying her hand in the ring with the male grappler, and more important, showing them a thing or two. But her entry into professional wrestling came probably a year later after she had won for herself four beauty contests.

Caroline still looks back on what she terms the 'old days' when the glamour and hard work of "mucking out" horses, schooling them and competing in Horse Jumping events, was the only thing in her young life. No boy friends, very little spare time whatsoever for social occasions, it was horses all the time. She never became involved at all with the opposite sex unless it was beating the pants off them at Fox Hunts or in the Show Jump ring. All the experts rated Caroline very high until the unfortunate fall changed her life and fortune in a drastic way.

Now she lives for wrestling has wrestled practically everywhere that is where they have permitted female wrestling—there's no doubt about it, the supporters just idolise Caroline at the Drill Hall, Peterborough, as an example. She has appeared way up at the Town Hall, Middlesbrough, at the Arcadia, Skegness, the Co-op Hall, Ilkeston, the Queens Hall Widnes, at halls in Birmingham Wellingborough, St. Ives, Hunstanton, Biggleswade, March Redruth, yes on that specific

occasion Caroline had to travel overnight to appear at the famous Flamingo Ballroom way down in Redruth, Cornwall.

Do wrestlers male or female really get hurt, I asked Lady Caroline. It had took me close on a month to finally pin her down for this interview. She was enjoying a couple of weeks rest between tours. Everybody has the idea, she says, that wrestling is just one big cut and dried twist. That the grapplers do not hurt each other, that injuries are stage rehearsed. If they are... I do wish they would let me in on it. Seriously, I had had eight contests prior to journeying to Cornwall. Admittedly I was very tired with the journey: During the course of the Tag-Match, I was literally thrown bodily over the top rope falling into the ringside seats. The patrons pushed me back in under the bottom rope in their exuberance, and the match continued although I was limping like a lame duck. It was the next day, on visiting the local hospital that it was discovered I had broken a bone in my foot. And that was that, I was out of wrestling for almost 3 months. Wrestlers obviously do have to take chances, it's their living, and they do try to win at all costs, after all, no one wants to engage a wrestler—male or female—if he has a succession losers, and obviously is losing his drawing power.

Will girl wrestlers and girl grappling ever become acceptable to everyone. Caroline has her own decided views on this subject. The objectors in the main are plain jealous, nothing more. As an example, at first the male wrestlers created quite a fuss, and would not appear on the same programme as the girls. But when they could see the promoter was quite prepared to give the

public their money back, rather than let us girls down, which in effect would mean all of us on that bill would lose our purses, the men saw it differently.....they also would be breaking their contract, and faith with the public. Never the less, the show did go on, and the male wrestlers have accepted the girls on equal footing. And especially since the Wrestling Federation granted Licences to girls, and gave its blessing to girl wrestling. So these days, it is commonplace to see girls prominent on presentations under the Wrestling Federation Banner. However, not all promoters in Britain stand by the girls. The "opposition" to Federation members—that is those people who hold the monopoly on Saturday T.V. telecasts, would NOT have the girls at any price, except as spectators paying for seats. That they feel is a different kettle of fish.

Caroline also tells me that there has been opposition in the form of local antagonism from various do-good councillors and Church authorities. In spite of this, only a couple of local authorities have banned the girls, where the venue is a Dirl Hall a Co-op Hall or Corn Exchange or privately owned concern, then the local authority has no jurisdiction and the girls on more than one occasion have completely 'sold' out the show before the event. Caroline goes on to say that there are good girl wrestlers besides poor wrestling gals. If fans see excellent bouts, then they will undoubtedly come again. But if they are served with a sub-standard one then it can do irreparable harm. And the advent of girl wrestlers on a programme where attendances have previously lagged, often stimulated new interest and helped to keep a show going, more so these days with the competition from television.

Remuneratively is it worth your while, I asked Caroline. Well, if you consider that for a quarter of an hour in the ring I can acquire as much as the average Secretary with a bonus for a win—that should answer your question. I still posed the question that I felt perhaps women were out of place in a wrestling ring. You have every right to your own opinion, Caroline replied, but do you object to women serving in the Forces, women police officers, traffic wardens, M.P.s women swimmers, athletes, show jumpers, judo participants, so *why not* women's wrestling. These days surely with women demanding and claiming equal pay with the males and women having gained for themselves the vote, isn't it old fashioned to suppress them. Women always get what they want in the end, she said emphatically.

Would you compete with a male in the ring, I asked her. Yes...said Caroline, I already have, and won too. Combining balance with leverage Caroline showed me how simple it is to turn someone onto his or her shoulders for a pin fall. If you know your stuff, you can match holds with anyone, and though I regret having to leave the glamour and excitement of the show ring the wrestling field has given me ten times more confidence in myself.

You still don't fancy girl wrestlers, well very soon men will be landing on the moon. You trying to tell me they will not want girls there too eventually.

To every question I threw at this diminutive girl professional wrestler she had an answer, and after watching her in action I have to agree, Caroline you most certainly are a "super-woman"...you have convinced me girl wrestlers are here to stay.

Picture above shows the petit LADY CAROLINE in her famous match against American lady champion SUGAR PIE HARLEM. The contest was the English version of the World Junior Girls Championship. Lady Caroline won over eight rounds after the New York star had gained the first fall in round three. Caroline equalised with a flying slip through and pin fall and the winner came with a one leg boston crab. The Americans prefer to monopolise all the titles, this was one occasion when an American girl wrestler came over for a major title chance. Lady Caroline retired from wrestling five years ago on the advent of motherhood. She has decreed her son Nicholas will never don wrestling boots. Rumour has it she is presently in America but whether she will eventually wrestle again is up for conjecture. She certainly set a shining example as the British girl champion wrestler.

HERE'S WHY THE LADY IS A CHAMP!

Wrestling referee and champion of the rights of girl grapplers

A VERY lovely young lady is rapidly becoming the toast of London's sports toffs and once you have seen her—and more important, met her—you'll have no difficulty understanding why.

This is the story of Lady Caroline—that's how she's billed on the wrestling programs—who, in the short period of 24 months, has become one of the biggest mat attractions in the United Kingdom.

She has quite a story. For openers, consider that Lady Caroline—*figuratively*—was thrown into wrestling! She started her career flat on her back!

I know you'll think your interviewer has gone daft, so let me explain, without further ado.

Lady Caroline, a sportswoman from a way back, is a noted horsewoman of considerable skill. She had extensive experience with show horses and guided many top notch horses over the hurdles.

One day she was thrown during a hunters drill in Essex and sustained a painful back injury which hospitalized her for quite a spell. During her long period of convalescence, Caroline started to read up on the professional wrestling game, particularly the matches at the local Victoria Hall in Oakham, Rutland.

Her doctors, for awhile, feared that her back would never return to complete normalcy much less permit Caroline to consider a wrestling career. She found out about that, in short order, by beginning a serious program of self-conditioning, featuring extensive bar bell drills.

Caroline worked out in the same gym as many pro wrestlers and picked up fine tips on the sport by observation, and intelligent questioning.

Believe it or not, Caroline learned the fundamentals of wrestling, not with members of her own sex—but with some of the toughest male grapplers in the gym.

While she was learning the "ropes" of wrestling and rebuilding her back, Caroline took time out to win four various beauty contests! This fact was not overlooked by

the ballyhoo department when she launched her wrestling career, just about two years ago.

She was a hit from the start for a girl with Caroline's determination—and background—could not fail to succeed at anything to which she devotes herself. Now wrestling is her complete life.

She has appeared everywhere women wrestlers are permitted to work, in the last two years, and is idolized at the Drill Hall in Peterborough. She has also demonstrated her skills way up at Middlesborough Town Hall at the Arcaria; at Skegness, the Co-Op Hall; Ilkeston, Widnes-Birmingham, Wellingborough, St. Ives, Hunstanton, Riggleswade, March, Redruth. She even traveled, overnight, to appear at the famous Flamingo Ballroom in Reduth, Cornwall.

A look back at her beginning is indicative of the grit that has carried this lovely female this far. She can remember the early days when she "mucked" horses and worked in the stables so she could learn all about the beasts she loved. Sreeple-chase racing then was the prime factor in her life. She had no time for dates or social life. She seemed
